


WHAT IS BIOSECURITY?

 Biosecurity is a strategic and integrated approach that encompasses the policy and regulatory frameworks (including instruments and activities) for analyzing and managing relevant risks to human, animal and plant life and health, and associated risks to the environment.

>>> Scientific & Regulatory <<<

 Biosecurity covers food safety, zoonoses, the introduction of animal and plant diseases and pests, the introduction and release of living modified organisms (LMOs) and their products (e.g. genetically modified organisms or GMOs), and the introduction and management of invasive alien species.

Role of BAF and its importance to Fiji's economy



- To protect Fiji and Fiji's agriculture sector against the entry of foreign pests and diseases affecting animals, plants, human beings and the environment.
- Conduct surveillance and monitoring of pests and diseases in Fiji and assessment of the status of regulated pests and diseases.
- To prevent the introduction, establishment and spread of regulated exotic pests and diseases and the release of organisms that might adversely affect animals, plants, human beings and the environment in Fiii.

Role of BAF and its importance to Fiji's economy



- To eradicate, contain or control the movement of regulated pests and diseases that are already present in Fiji.
- To facilitate safe trade (import and export) of animals and plants and their products, and related equipment and technology.
- To facilitate market access of plant and animal products to viable agro-export markets through inspection and certification in compliance with the biosecurity requirements of the receiving countries.









Role of BAF and its importance to Fiji's economy



- To protect the Fijian Border from the entry of prohibited or regulated articles through border inspection and consignment clearance.
- To facilitate international cooperation to prevent the spread of pests and diseases affecting plants, animals, human beings and the environment.







INTERNATIONAL OBLIGATIONS

International legislation regulating global trade

- WTO- SPS (Agreement on the Application of Sanitary & Phytosanitary Measures)
 - Sets out the basics rules for global agricultural trade
 - Subscribes to the principle of equal market access and international co-operation in protecting human, animal and plant Health
- WTO SPS recognize 3 Standards Setting Bodies
 - ▶ PPC International Plant Protection Convention
 - CODEX Codex Alimentarius Commision
 - **➢OIE** Office of International Epizootics / World Animal Health Organization

What is an SPS Measure?

A measure taken to protect:

Human or animal health from risks arising from additives, contaminants, toxins or disease organisms in food, drink, feedstuff



Pesticide MRLs

Human life

from plant- or animal-carried disease



BSE-related restrictions

Animal or plant life

from pest, diseases, disease-causing organisms



Prevent introduction of fruit fly

Territory of Member from other damage caused by entry, establishment or spread of pests



Seed regulation to avoid introduction of exotic weeds

Key provision of SPS Agreement:

Members shall base their SPS measures on international standards (Codex, IPPC, OIE)

DO NOT move any Beehive, Bees, Queen bees or used equipments from your farm without prior approval from BAF

Moving the above is an offence under the Biosecurity Act 2008 attracting a fine of up to \$1,000 for an Individual and \$5,000 for Body Corporate

African swine fever (ASF)



African swine fever ('ASF') is a deadly pig disease which

is now spreading across the world and reached the Pacific region



ASF virus does not affect humans but it can spread by humans through ASF contaminated materials such as shoes, clothing and farm equipment's. Hence, it is important to declare if you have visited any pig farms or have come into contact with any pigs in overseas.

Plant Exports: ePhyto Certifications



- What is a phytosanitary certificate?
- What is an ePhytosanitary certificate?
- Major advantages of ePhyto:
 - Faster templates available with additional declarations
 - Less fraud and mistakes easier to replace
 - Cheaper direct submissions to NPPO's
- In house trainings will be on-going for staff and stakeholders
- Currently exchanging actively with New Zealand
- Trialing with USA and Australia
- Similar system is expected soon be adopted for Zoo-sanitary products

Recognized Treatments for Exports



- Fumigations
- Frozen minus 18°C for 7 days
- Dusting with chemicals
- Dipping with insecticides
- Spraying with pesticides
- Production in Area Freedom from pests



- The Vuvale relationship with Australia has improved a lot and is continuing to do so.
- Within this year, after opening of the borders, the Chief Plant Protection Officer of Australia has made 2 visits to Fiji to attend regional forums and provide support and guidance.
- Similarly, The Australian Chief Veterinary Officer has also made a visit to Fiji after border restrictions were uplifted.
- Biosecurity Australia has also created the position of Director, Pacific Engagement in the department to handle affairs of the Pacific region in regards to biosecurity affairs.
- These visits and collaboration provide opportunities to the counterparts to discuss in detail and pro-actively work on mutual solutions on any emerging issues to allow economic benefits to both nations.



- BICON: Import conditions search website
- BICON contains the Australian import conditions for more than 18,000 foreign plant, animal, mineral and human products.
- Pacific Exports Program provides capacity enhancements and skills improvements for all entities along the exports chain from Pacific to Australia for fresh agricultural produce. A pilot program has been completed and the first training is upcoming in November 2022. It comprises of a 7 module theory and has practical components to complement the understanding of participants to achieve compliances.
- Market access of other commodities to Australia are in negotiations



- Cargoes being delayed to Australia
- sea container congestions is causing delays in goods reaching Australia
- issue around inspection times is not isolated to goods from Fiji only
- clients seeking inspections are seeing delays to a certain degree, most heavily felt in Melbourne and Sydney
- or up to six weeks for sea freight cargoes
- includes Covid impacts on frontline staff of DAFF
- increase in trade of approximately 17% and
- the number of increasing biosecurity threats to Australia including Khapra beetle as a hitchhiker pest and now Foot & Mouth Disease together with Lumpy Skin Disease



- Solutions for the Industry
- DAFF has sought to bring in more biosecurity officers, however it does take time to get them trained and become "job ready"
- DAFF has rolled out the Biosecurity Portal which allows Customs
 Brokers to book inspections online and monitor progress in the queue
- DAFF offers overtime bookings for inspection, however only a small traders take-up these opportunities
- the department has created a new approved arrangement to allow Approved Agencies to conduct rural tailgates to free up inspectors for higher risk inspections
- However, biosecurity risk management is first and foremost our responsibility.


Int'l Year of Plant Health - 2020








Concluding...
